#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2019-1**

RESOLUTION AWARDING A CONTRACT TO CORNELL & COMPANY INC. FOR THE BURLINGTON-BRISTOL BRIDGE S-SPAN DECK REPLACEMENT PROJECT (BCBC-201809).

WHEREAS, the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") has determined that it requires the services of a contracting firm capable of providing certain specialized contracting services for the Commission for the project titled "Burlington-Bristol Bridge S-Span Deck Replacement (BCBC-201809)"; and

**WHEREAS**, the Commission solicited and accepted bids from such contracting firms and opened said bids on December 18, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is satisfied that Cornell & Company Inc. ("Cornell") was the lowest of three bidders and has submitted a satisfactory and responsive bid, and has the

required knowledge and expertise to perform such services; and

WHEREAS, the maximum amount of this contract with Cornell shall be Eight Million, Seven Hundred Eleven Thousand, Eight Hundred Dollars (\$8,711,800.00), and sufficient funds are available for payment for those services as evidenced by the Certificate of Availability of Funds, attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Burlington County Bridge Commission as follows:

- 1. The Commission hereby awards a contract for specialized contracting services as set forth above to Cornell, and the Executive Director and the Secretary of the Commission are hereby authorized to execute a contract with Cornell.

- **WHEREAS**, W.J. Castle, P.E. & Associates, P.C. ("W.J. Castle") has been approved as a qualified professional and is a member of the shared pool; and
- **WHEREAS**, upon receipt and review of the proposal submitted by W.J. Castle, it was determined that the proposal provided acceptable and appropriate contract terms and conditions for the Commission; and
- **WHEREAS**, this contract is being awarded through a fair and open process, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq.; and
- WHEREAS, the maximum amount of this contract shall be One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), and sufficient funds are available for payment for those services as evidenced by the Certificate of Availability of Funds, attached hereto; and

- **WHEREAS,** upon receipt and review of the proposal submitted by CME, it was determined that the proposal provided acceptable and appropriate contract terms and conditions for the Commission; and
- **WHEREAS**, this contract is being awarded through a fair and open process, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq.; and
- WHEREAS, the maximum amount of this contract shall be One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), and sufficient funds are available for payment for those services as evidenced by the Certificate of Availability of Funds, attached hereto; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Local Public Contracts Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq.) requires that the Resolution authorizing the award of contracts for such services and the contract itself must be available for public inspection.

WHEREAS, Commission staff recommended that the Commission award the contract for Year Two (January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019) to PSX Inc. ("PSX") in the amount of \$120,000.00 with the option to extend the contract for Year Three; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chief Financial Officer of the Commission has determined that sufficient funds are available for payment for said services, as evidenced by the Certificate of Availability of Funds attached hereto and made a part hereof.

- **NOW**, **THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Burlington County Bridge Commission as follows:

WHEREAS, the Burlington County Bridge Commission ("Commission") solicited bids to procure services for the Tacony-Palmyra Bridge Rib Light Rewiring Project (BCBC-201810); and

WHEREAS, three (3) bids were received for this project on December 5, 2018 at 11:00 A.M., at which time the bids were opened and reviewed by Commission staff and the consulting engineer; and

WHEREAS, MJF Electrical Contracting and Maintenance, Inc. ("MJF") was the lowest bidder at \$1,500,000.00 but does not possess the required NJDOT Prequalified Work Classification 7 Electrical; and

**WHEREAS**, all three (3) bids were more than the 20 percent above the engineer's estimate of \$815,810.00; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the desire and determination of the Commission to reject all bids which were received for the aforesaid project, based upon the recommendations of the Commission staff and its consulting engineer for the reasons set forth above.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Burlington County Bridge Commission that for the reasons hereinabove expressed, the Commission hereby rejects the bid received on December 5, 2018 for the project titled "Tacony-Palmyra Bridge Rib Light Rewiring (BCBC-201810)".

- <u>Section 3</u>. The Local Finance Board is hereby respectfully requested to consider such application and to record its findings, recommendations and/or approvals as provided by the applicable New Jersey Statute.
